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1. Public Notices

1.1 Notice of Project Commencement and Public Meeting #1

The SunE Solar Farm Renewable Energy Approval process began in 2011 with a Notice of Project and Public Meeting #1 published in The Chesterville Record on August 24, 2011 and on September 21, 2011, respectively, as detailed in Table 1, below. The Initial Public Meeting was held on September 28, 2011 at South Stormont's Senior Support Centre, 12 Memorial Square, Ingleside, Ontario.

Notices were made available on the proponent's website (www.sunedison.ca/Bruining1). On August 30, 2011 a copy of the notice was also hand distributed to all residences within 120 m of the project location (as shown in Appendix F-B), which included to residences along Anderson Road, Macleod Road and Farran's Point Road. Additional mailings were completed to non-resident landowners and the mailing list has been included in Appendix F-E. Copies of the notice were sent to the clerk of the Township of South Stormont (lower-tier municipality), the clerk of the United Counties of Stormont, Dundas and Glengarry (upper-tier municipality), the MOE District Manager (Ottawa District) and the MOE Director of Approvals. The notice contained information on the project location, the proposed size of the project, the proponent, the process and a key map of the original Project Area. Copies of the Draft Project Description Report were also mailed to the clerks and the MOE and a copy was posted on the proponent's website (www.sunedison.ca/Bruining1).

A copy of the Public Meeting #1 notice, list of attendees and the display boards presented at the open house are included in Appendix F-B. Further details of the public meeting are included in Section 5.

1.2 Notice of Public Meeting #2

The notice of Public Meeting #2 was published in the local newspapers (July 7, 2012, August 1, 2012 and September 12, 2012) in The Chesterville Record, as detailed in Table 1, below, and were made available on the proponent's website (www.sunedison.ca/Bruining1). On July 17, 2012 a copy of the notices was also hand distributed to all residences within 120 m of the project location (as shown in Appendix F-C), as well as any others who had requested that they be added to the mailing list. This included mailing of the notices and also emailing the notices to those requesting to be added to the mailing list at Public Meeting #1. Additional mailings were completed to non-resident landowners and the mailing list has been included in Appendix F-C.

Copies of the notice were sent to the clerk of the Township of South Stormont (lower-tier municipality), the clerk of the United Counties of Stormont, Dundas and Glengarry (upper-tier municipality), the MOE District Manager (Ottawa District) and the MOE Director of Approvals.

The second Public Meeting was held on September 19, 2012 at the South Stormont Community Hall, Long Sault, Ontario.

In order to conform with the requirements of O.Reg. 359/09, the notice contained information on the project location, the proposed size of the project, the proponents, the process and a key map of the Project Location. Also included in this notice was the location, time and date of Public Meeting #2 and where the draft project reports were available for public review (both hard copy and electronic versions), dates of the review period and to whom and where comments could be forwarded. A copy of the notice, public mailing list, list of attendees and the display boards presented at the open house are included in Appendix F-C.

1.3 Distribution of Documents for Review

Prior to the final public meeting (held September 19, 2012) the Draft Renewable Energy Approval documents for consultation were made available for public review for at least 60 days, as required by O.Reg. 359/09. These reports were made available on the proponent's website (www.sunedison.ca/Bruining1) on June 15, 2012, and were also made available for review at the Township of South Stormont and United Counties of Stormont, Dundas and Glengarry municipal offices on that same date, 96 days prior to Public Meeting #2.

Section 4 below provides further discussion on the release of the documents to the clerks of the municipalities (Township and United Counties) on June 15, 2012 (96 days prior to Public Meeting #2).

All project components are proposed to be located within the Township of South Stormont, in the United Counties of Stormont, Dundas and Glengarry.

2. Agency Consultation

2.1 MNR Review

On May 8, 2012 information was received from the MNR on the request for Records Review for the Bruining 1 Solar Power Project. GENIVAR completed the Records Review on May 8, 2012 and submitted it to the MNR. The following final documents were submitted to the MNR for review to ensure compliance with the Natural Heritage requirements of O.Reg. 359/09:

- *Natural Heritage Assessment Records Review Report, SunEdison Bruining 1 Solar Energy Project* (May 8, 2012)
- *Natural Heritage Assessment Site Investigation Report, SunEdison Bruining 1 Solar Energy Project* (June 13, 2012)
- *Natural Heritage Assessment Evaluation of Significance Report, SunEdison Bruining 1 Solar Energy Project* (June 13, 2012)
- *Natural Heritage Assessment Environmental Impact Study Report, SunEdison Bruining 1 Solar Farm* (June 13, 2012)

Final confirmation from the MNR was received on June 13, 2012. Copies of the correspondence and final report can be found in Appendix C. Copies of the reports and the letter were posted on the proponent's website and were made available for review at the Township of South Stormont and the United Counties of Stormont, Dundas and Glengarry municipal offices and at Public Meeting #2.

The MNR was also contacted for the Water Body Records Review. On May 2012, the MNR provided a records review request response to GENIVAR. A *Water Body Records Review, Bruining 1 Solar Energy Project*, (June 2012) report was completed by GENIVAR and is included in Appendix C.

2.2 MTCS Review

The Stage 1 and 2 Archaeological Assessment for KINU- Bruining Solar Farm, Concession 2 Plan 266, Lot 3 & 4, Part of Lots B & C Township of South Stormont, United Counties of Stormont, Dundas and Glengarry, Ontario (November 10, 2011) report was submitted to the Ministry of Tourism, Culture and Sport (MTCS) for review on November 20, 2011 by the Archaeologists Inc. The MTCS issued a letter of acceptance on December 12, 2011 agreeing with the findings and recommendations of the report. A copy of the acceptance letter is included in Appendix D.

The Cultural Heritage Resource Assessment: Built Heritage Resources and Cultural Heritage Landscapes, SunE Bruining 1 Solar Farm, Township South Stormont, Ontario (May 2012 (June 2012)) report was submitted to the Ministry of Tourism, Culture and Sport (MTCS) for review in May 2012 by Archaeological Services Inc. The MTCS issued a letter of acceptance on July 18, 2012 agreeing with the findings and recommendations of the report. A copy of the acceptance letter is included in Appendix D.

Copies of the archaeological assessment and cultural heritage resource assessment reports and the letters of acceptance were posted on the proponent's website and were made available for review at the Township of South Stormont and the United Counties of Stormont, Dundas and Glengarry municipal offices and at Public Meeting #2.

2.3 Raisin Region Conservation Authority (RVCA)

RRCA staff were consulted throughout the REA process to keep them apprised of the project activities and seek input on the proposed project. RRCA staff provided a response to the records review request on September 21, 2011 (included in Appendix D (Natural Heritage Assessment Reports in Appendix A)). RRCA noted that there was a watercourse within the Project Location within Lot 26 and 27, Concession 2. No information was available regarding the name of the watercourse. Since receipt of the RRCA letter, the Project Location boundaries were modified so that the Ingleside Swamp Provincially Significant Wetland and associated watercourses were not present within the Project Location boundary.

A portion of the watercourse remains within 120 m of the eastern Project Location boundary. For any watercourses on the property or within the 120 m buffer, RRCA would require appropriate development setbacks and any alteration to a waterway required written approval from RRCA.

3. Aboriginal Consultation

Aboriginal consultation has been undertaken by GENIVAR and Patricia Stirbys on behalf of SunEdison in order to meet the requirements to consult. These activities are detailed below.

3.1 Director's List

On August 25, 2011, a copy of the Draft Project Description Report was submitted to the Director of Approvals in order to receive the List of Aboriginal Communities to Consult. A response was received from the MOE on October 27, 2011 and identified the following Aboriginal Community to consult:

1. Mohawks of the Akwesasne – may have constitutionally protected treaty or aboriginal rights which may be impacted by the project;
2. No groups were identified that may be interested in any negative effects of the project.

3.2 Distribution of Notices and Reports

In the absence of a Director's List, SunEdison undertook consultations prior to receiving the list. The table below identifies the notices and documents sent to each First Nation's group. A copy of the correspondence is provided in Appendices F-H and F-I.

5. Public Consultation

5.1 Summary of Comments

Approximately 5 people attended the second public meeting, with 5 signing the sign-in sheet. Generally, comments were positive with no significant concerns.
